One of the largest continuous humid areas on the planet. It houses 3,500 species of plants, 124 species of mammals, 463 species of birds and 325 species of fish. **Bird Species: 463**

Transition between continental and marine ecosystems, with intense geological variation and rich biodiversity, such as: mangroves, coral reefs, dunes, rocky shores, beaches, cliffs, islands, lagoons, restingas, marshes and estuaries. There are almost 1,300 species of fish. **Bird Species: 150**

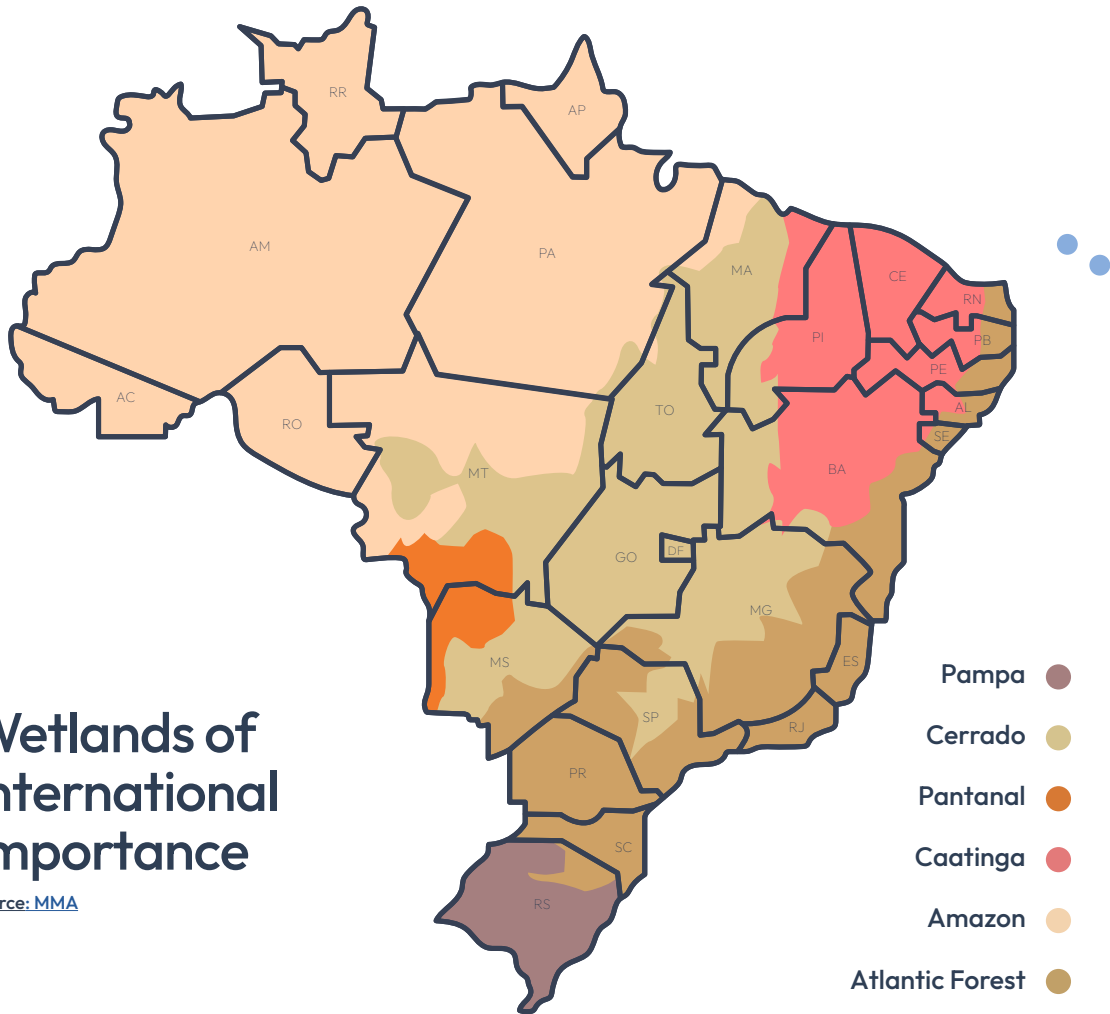

- The **variety of biomes** in the country allows for a wide diversity of fauna and flora species
- Seasonal **abundance** of migratory birds.
- **The mild climate** allows the activity to be practiced throughout the year.
- Brazil is an excellent destination for **birdwatching families**.
- **Brazilian cuisine** is diverse and full of **aromas, flavors and knowledge** that can only be experienced in Brazil.
- **Connectivity with different countries.** We have 4,955 direct flights (with 1,187,126 seats) from 27 countries to 17 Brazilian cities, with 31 airlines (April/2024).
- Many **destinations specialized** in welcoming birdwatchers, with guides specialized in each region and bilingual, national and international operators specialized in itineraries within Brazil
- A **huge biodiversity** that guarantees, in addition to birds, enjoying and getting to know various plants, such as bromeliads and orchids, insects such as moths, butterflies and dragonflies, a great diversity of mammals such as jaguars, monkeys, pink dolphins, opportunities for observation and contemplation.
