



Brazilian Savanna

Recognized as the richer savanna in the world, holds 5% of the Planet's biodiversity.

Brazil has the greatest biodiversity of the planet (20% of the number total species on Earth.) (MMA).

Brazil has 12.262 species of fauna, 120 thousand species of invertebrates and 8.930 of vertebrates (734 mammals, 1.982 birds, 732 reptiles, 973 amphibians, 3.150 continental fish and 1.358 marine fish.) (ICMBIO).



Atlantic Forest

Recognized as a national heritage, copper around 15% of National territory.

UNESCO Natural World Heritage Sites

Be considered a Natural World Heritage Site means being an exceptional formation and a physical, biological and geological habitat of animal species and unique plants that may be endangered. Natural World Heritage Sites protect these areas considered exceptional from the point view of biological diversity and the landscape.
